When they were standing behind the car they were facing in the direction of the passenger side. DUGAN was standing behind JEANINE. It was at this time he hit her on the head with a tire iron. The force of the blow caused her to fall towards the car striking her face on the rear bumper. (McCulloch further explained she hit the part of the bumper which encircles the rear right fender). He said when he hit her it sounded like a "bone breaking, but muffled". DUGAN hit her on the head a second time with the tire iron, while she lay on the Prairie Path. He moved her from the Prairie Path to the depression where she was eventually found. When he laid her on the ground she "made a noise" which scared DUGAN. He grabbed a branch and hit her again. When he hit her she was face up. He threw the branch away. He left her at this time with her feet facing the Prairie Path. Mr. McCulloch said DUGAN left the tire iron at a friend's house. He attempted to retrieve it at a later date, but it was gone. He does not recall when he went back to his friend's house.
