

“You should watch what you say to people.” “You could get hurt while you are in jail.” “We want to make sure you don’t open your mouth.”

- i. They repeated a telephone conversation I had had with the attorney’s word for word.
- j. They pointed at an emergency evacuation tunnel from the basement room and said I could get hurt and they would say I tried to escape.
- k. They knew I was scheduled to be released on May 31, 1999, and Sergeant Wick said that “money was probably a big worry” and they “could help me out if I kept my mouth shut.” This was the same deputy who told me I had to testify against CARLOS RODRIGUEZ at his termination hearing. I was never served a subpoena for that hearing.
- l. They said that they could “hit him with another charge” and that “you won’t get out on the 31st.”
- m. That CARLOS RODRIGUEZ’s attorney had prepared my statement to sign, but I was scared and did not know what to do.
- n. That the DuPage trial was taking place at this time and they continued to take me in the basement room (a diagram is attached) and threatened me.
